GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The portion of township 26 south, range 3 west, covered by this resurvey, is located approximately 2 miles east of the town of Glide, Oregon. The area is drained primarily by Britt Creek, with a number of other small drainages. The elevations range from 800 feet above sea level near the ¼ section corner of sections 10 and 15, to 1680 feet above sea level near the E 1/16 section corner of sections 15 and 22.

Access into the area is via Lone Rock Road, and a number of gravelled and dirt roads extending from it.

The dominant timber species are fir, cedar, hemlock, pine, oak, madrone, maple, and yew. Undergrowth consists of poison oak, salal, fern, arrowwood, ceanothus, grass, and timber reproduction.

No evidence of minerals was noted in the area covered by this survey.

The average of a considerable number of readings over the entire area gives a value of 19½°E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to 2° in local attraction.
