	<p>From this point the S 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 22 and 23, erroneously established by Wofford, Rogers, and Chatters, in 1973-79, bears N. 5° 32' W., 0.757 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 2 ½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.</p>
