

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land involved in the foregoing survey is located in Douglas County, within a four miles radius of Scottsburg, Oregon. The area is mountainous, with elevations ranging from about 1,439 feet above sea level near the closing corner of sections 28 and 29, to about 100 feet above sea level, near the ¼ section corner of sections 16 and 21.

Access into the area is by way of several gravelled roads off Oregon State Highway No. 38. The area northerly of Scottsburg is drained by numerous creeks flowing southerly to the Umpqua River, and the
