CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the subdivisional lines, township 32 south, range 7 west, Willamette Meridian, Oregon.

The history of surveys pertaining to this resurvey is as follows:

The subdivisional lines were surveyed by William H. Byars, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1881.

A portion of the subdivisional lines was resurveyed by G. Steven Popken and James J. Carlson, Cadastral Surveyors, in 1975-76.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, and the Special Instructions dated March 1, 1984, for Group Number 1199, Oregon.

The directions of the lines refer to the true meridian as determined by deflections from azimuths obtained by direct solar observations.

Preliminary to the resurvey, the lines of the original surveys were retraced and search was made for all corners and other calls of the record. Identified corners were remonumented in their original positions. The retracement data were thoroughly verified and only the true line field notes are given herein. Only those lines bounding or crossing public lands were blazed. All lines not forming a closure were measured twice.

The geographic position of the corner of sections 11, 12, 13, and 14, as scaled from the Canyonville, Oregon, quadrangle map, published by the United States Geological Survey, in 1954, is as follows:

Latitude 42° 47.8' N. Longitude 123° 29.1' W.

The mean magnetic declination is 18° 30' E.

A cedar, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 78° E., 26 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, S. 66½° E.,)

A madrone root crown, size indeterminate, bears S. 45° W., 20 lks. dist., no marks visible. (Record, S. 60° W.)
