CHAINS

The lands included in the foregoing survey are located approximately 10 miles northwesterly of Glendale, Oregon. The area is drained by Buck Creek, Dads Creek, and Martin Creek, with numerous other seasonal drainages. The elevations vary from about 2100 feet above sea level near the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner of sections 11 and 14, to about 2850 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 11, 12, 13, and 14.

Access into the area is via Middle Creek Road and a number of gravelled and dirt roads branching from it.

Timber in the area consists of fir, maple, oak, cedar, madrone, yew, pine, chinquapin, and alder, with undergrowth of salal, poison oak, vine maple, Oregon grape, ferns, hazel, manzanita, rhododendron, arrowwood, blackberry, and young timber.

The soil is composed of a rocky clay, with some scattered rock outcroppings.

No evidence of minerals was noted in the area covered by this resurvey.

The average of a number of readings over the area gives a value of $18^{\circ} 30'$ E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to 1° in local attraction.
