## CHAINS

### GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land included in the foregoing survey is located in Douglas County, about 8 miles northwesterly from the town of Oakland, Oregon. Access is by way of Driver Valley Road and numerous other gravel roads leading from it.

The area is drained by several small creeks draining into Elk Creek which flows northerly. Elevations range from about 1,100 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 3, 4, 9, and 10, to about 2,160 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 4, 5, 8, and 9.

The soil is composed generally of rocky clay loam. Timber consists mainly of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, chinquapin, alder, and ash. The undergrowth consists of salal, vine maple, Oregon grape, poison oak, and fern.

No evidence of mineral deposits was noted along the lines surveyed.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of  $19^{\circ} 30'$  E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to  $0^{\circ} 30'$  in local attraction.
