N. 20° W., 72 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 55° W.,

marks visible on partially healed blaze.

A cedar stump, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 11° E.,
41 lks. dist., with scribe marks CS BT visible
on open blaze.
