T. 20 S., R. 7 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

A roothole, bears N. $65\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 18 lks. dist.,
with a down cedar alongside, 8 ins. diam.,
with scribe marks T20S R7W S34 CS BT visible
on open blaze.

A roothole, bears N. 47° W., 33 lks. dist.,
with a down cedar alongside, 7 ins. diam., with
scribe marks T20S R7W S33 CS BT visible on open
blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in
the ground, directly atop iron pipe, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 6 ins. diam., bears N. $27\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 179
lks. dist., mkd. X BT.

From this point, a point established by Wilford N.
Haines, Registered Land Surveyor No. 239, in 1958, bears
S. $25\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 0.055 chs. dist., monumented with a 1 in. "T"
shaped iron rod, firmly set, projecting 5 ins. above
ground.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, madrone, fir, yew, maple, cedar, alder,
chinquapin, hemlock, and cascara; undergrowth, vinemaple
arrowwood, hazel, blackberry, poison oak, huckleberry,
salmonberry, ferns Oregon grape, salal, and thimbleberry.

S. $88^{\circ} 40'$ W., on the S. bdy. of sec. 33.

Descend over SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense
undergrowth.

1.45 Ravine, drains SE.; asc. over SE. slope.

21.30 Ridge, bears N. 20° E. and S. 20° W.; desc. over broken
SW. slope.

23.03 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 4 only, T. 21 S., R. 7 W.,
perpetuated and recorded by Wilford N. Haines, Registered
Land Surveyor No. 239, in 1958, monumented with a 1 in.
"T" shaped iron rod, firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above
ground, from which the remains of the original bearing
trees:

A decayed fir stump, 44 ins. diam., bears
N. 13° W., 44 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A burned fir stump, 40 ins. diam., bears
S. 63° W., 13 lks. dist., no marks visible.

and the remains of a bearing tree mkd. by Haines

A sawed fir stump, 69 ins. diam., bears
S. 8° W., $35\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with healed blaze.
