A sawed fir stump, 72 ins. diam., bears N. 51° W., 80 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on opened blaze. (Record, N. 40° W.)

A sawed fir stump, 60 ins. diam., bears S. 27° W., 40 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record S. 32° W.)

A hemlock, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 87½° E., 9 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 21 ins. diam., bears N. 8½° E., 121 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and new bearing trees

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 3° W., 67 lks. dist., mkd. X BT.

An alder, 7 ins. diam. bears N. 52° W., 26 lks. dist., mkd. T2OS R7W S27 BT on bark.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, yew, alder, ash, elderberry, chinquapin, maple, and willow; undergrowth, vine maple, blackberry, salmonberry, salal, Oregon grape, arrowwood, hazel, ferns, wild rose, thimbleberry, and young timber.

From the cor. of secs. 33 and 34 only, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.

N. 0° 26' W., bet. secs. 33 and 34.

Ascend over SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Ridge, bears N. 55° E. and S. 55° W.; desc. over broken NW. slope; also gravelled road, 30 lks. wide, bears N. 55° E. and S. 55° W.
