CHAINS

the corner of sections 27, 28, 33, and 34, to about 1500 feet above sea level near the 1/4 section corner of section 34 only on the south boundary of the township.

The soil in the area is composed of rocky clay, with a sandy loam in the river bottom. Timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, yew alder, madrone, chinquapin, ash, maple, cherry, apple, cascara, and willow. Undergrowth is mainly vine maple, ferns salal, Oregon grape, poison oak, hazel, arrowwood, blackberry, huckleberry, salmonberry, wild rose, thimbleberry, manzanita, and young timber.

There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines surveyed.

The average of a number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° E. for the mean magnetic declination.
