CHAINS

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., with magnetic, plastic breakaway base, 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap md.

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 43° E., 63 lks. dist., mkd. X BT.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 41½° W., 58 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R6W S4 CC BT.

From this point, the original closing corner of secs. 3 and 4, bears N. 0° 34' W., 0.265 chs. dist., perpetuated and recorded by Wilford N. Haines, Registered Land Surveyor No. 239, in 1956, monumented with a "T" shaped iron post, 1 in. dia., firmly set flush with the ground with washer mkd.

A decayed fir stump, 38 ins. diam., bears S. 22° W., 83 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on an opened blaze.

A fir, 49 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 23 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

From this same point, the cor. of secs. 33 and 34 only, bears N. 88° 56' W., 6.36 chs. dist., hereinbefore described.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, yew madrone maple, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, Oregon grape, arrow-wood, hazel, blackberry, vine maple, devils club, salmonberry, huckleberry, ferns, and young timber.

The point for ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 3 only, T. 21 S., R. 6 W., is at midpoint on the N. bdy. of sec. 3.
