	<p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, directly over iron rod, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>W 1/16 S 35</u> 1985</p> <hr style="width: 20%; margin: auto;"/> <p>S. 89° 47' W., beginning new measurement.</p> <p>Descend over NW. slope.</p>
1.95	<p>Creek, 10 lks. wide, course S. 40° W.; asc. over SE. slope.</p>
5.60	<p>Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 60° E. and S. 20° W.</p>
13.15	<p>The standard cor. of secs. 2 and 3, perpetuated and recorded by Wilford N. Haines, Registered Land Surveyor, No. 239, in 1957, monumented with a 1 in. "T" shaped iron rod, firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A root hole, bears S. 15° W., 10 lks. dist., with a down fir lying down hill, 35 ins. diam., no marks visible.</p> <p>and the remains of a bearing tree mkd. by Haines</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A root hole, bears S. 65° E., 45 lks. dist., with a sawed fir stump lying alongside, 20 ins. diam., with scribe marks W S 2 BT visible on opened blaze.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron rod, 16 ins. long, 5/8 in. diam., cemented 8 ins. in bedrock, with aluminum cap, 1 1/2 ins. diam., mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>S 3/5 2</u> S C T 23 S R 7 W 1984</p> <p>from which a bearing object and a new bearing tree</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A rock outcrop, 4 x 3 x 3 feet, bears S. 58 3/4° E., 97 lks. dist., mkd. X BO.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 17 3/4° W., 58 lks. dist., mkd. T23S R7W S3 SC BT Deposit "T" shaped iron rod alongside the corner.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, cedar, yew, hemlock, madrone, maple, oak, ash, dogwood, willow, alder, cherry, and chinquapin; undergrowth, ferns, Oregon grape, salal, arrowwood, hazel, vine maple, huckleberry, blackberry, thimbleberry, poison oak, salmonberry, wild rose, and young timber.</p>
