CHAINS

A cedar, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 43° W., 78 lks. dist., with scribe marks T22S R7W S27 BT visible on partially healed blaze. (Record, S. 41 1/2° W.)

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 26° W., 157 lks. dist., with scribe marks T22S R7W S22 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 42 1/2° E., 55 lks. dist., mkd. T22S R7W S26 BT.

Land mountainous.

Soil, rocky clayloam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, madrone, dogwood, ash, alder, and yew; undergrowth, vine maple, salal, ocean spray, Oregon grape, hazel, blackberry, poison oak, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 23 and 24 only, perpetuated and recorded by Milo E. Godfrey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962, further perpetuated and recorded by Gary L. Langlitz, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1975, monumented with an iron post, 1 1/4 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 3 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 31 1/2° E., 44 lks. dist., no marks visible on opened blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Godfrey

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 23° E., 20 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A maple, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 86 3/4° W., 80 lks. dist., mkd. T22S R7W S26 BT.

No suitable tree available in NW. quadrant.

S 89° 35' W., bet. secs. 23 and 26.

Ascend over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

4.75 Spur, slopes N. 30° E.; desc. over NW. slope

14.40 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course N. 25° E.; asc. over SE. slope.

21.20 Ravine, drains S. 80° E.; asc. over NE. slope

35.60 Ridge, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.; desc. over SW. slope.
