**GENERAL DESCRIPTION**

The portion of the township covered by this resurvey is located in Douglas County, about 4 miles southeast of the town of Elkton, Oregon. The township is drained primarily by Elk Creek, which flows in a westerly direction into the Umpqua River. The main access into the area is gained by way of State Highways 38 and 138, and a number of gravelled and dirt roads extending from them. Elevations range from about 520 feet above sea level near the 1/4 section corner of sections 14 and 23, to about 1770 feet above sea level near the center 1/4 section corner of section 35.

Timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, ash, madrone, maple, chinquapin, and alder. The undergrowth consists of fern, salal, blackberry, poison oak, vine maple, Oregon grape, and young timber. Portions of the area have been logged.

The soil consists mainly of rocky clay loam. There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines resurveyed.

The average of a considerable number of readings over all parts of the resurvey gives a value of 18° 45' E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° in local attraction.
