from which the remains of an original bearing tree

A fir snag, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 43 lks. dist., with scribe marks T30S visible on opened blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Tracy

A grand fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 4° W., 79 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A grand fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 50° W., 31 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed double blaze.

and new bearing trees

A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears N. 18° E., 11 lks. dist., mkd. X BT.

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 63½° E., 81 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R8W S36 BT.

From this point, a point established by Roger H. Gee, Registered Engineer No. 3723, in 1956, bears N. 49° W., 0.15 chs. dist, monumented with an iron pipe, ½ in. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, from which a bearing tree mkd. by Gee:

A grand fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 60° W., 63 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, pine, alder, madrone, live oak, chinquapin, and yew; undergrowth, poison oak, Oregon grape, salal, arrowwood, hazel, vine maple, deanothus, manzanita, blackberry, huckleberry, buckbrush, ferns and young timber.

From the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 26, perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1958, monumented with a steel fence post, firmly set, projecting 4 ft. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir, 52 ins. diam., bears S. 25° E., 32 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on bark blaze.
