CHAINS

The corner is located on the E. edge of a gravelled road, 25 lks. wide, bears N. 30° W. and S. 30° E.

Descend over broken NE. slope.

The cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26, perpetuated by Roger H. Gee, Registered Engineer No. 3723, in 1955, from original evidence no longer in existence, and further perpetuated and recorded by Gary Langlitz, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1974, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

from which the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Gee

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 71° E., 66 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir snag, 46 ins. diam., bears S. 22½° E., 165 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Langlitz

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 45° W., 112 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

and new bearing trees

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 50° E., 29 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R8W S25 BT.

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 27 ¾° W., 14½ lks. dist., mkd. X BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, yew, pine, madrone, ash, oak, willow, chinquapin, and maple; undergrowth, poison oak, huckleberry, salmonberry, blackberry, Oregon grape, salal, arrowwood, hazel, ferns, and young timber.

From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 24 and 25, perpetuated and recorded by Howard W. Johnstone, Registered Land Surveyor No. 498, in 1962, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:

A sawed fir stump, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 80° E., 17 lks. dist., no marks visible.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Johnstone

A sawed fir stump. 16 ins. diam., bears S. 62° E., 40 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S visible on a partially healed blaze (alongside of which is a down fir, 16 ins. diam., with scribe marks BT visible on a partially healed blaze.)
