The cor. of secs. 3 and 4 only, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., perpetuated and recorded by Arthur Boyer, Registered Engineer No. 1581, in 1949, and further perpetuated and recorded by John M. Powell, Deputy County Surveyor in 1967, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 14 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 52° E., 16 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Boyer

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 13° W., 37 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Powell

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 7 3/4° E., 20 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.

From this point, a point established and recorded by Howard W. Johnstone, Registered Land Surveyor No. 498, in 1979, bears S. 0° 15' E., 0.08 chs. dist., monumented with an iron rod, 5/8 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with aluminum, cap, 2 ins. diam., mkd. 1979 T29S 33 R8W 4 3 T30S LS 498.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, oak, madrone, cedar, pine, hemlock, alder, yew, chinquapin, dogwood, maple, and cherry; undergrowth, vine maple, poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, Oregon grape, salal, salmonberry, blackberry, manzanita, ceanothus, rhododendron, wild rose, and young timber.
