A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 24° W., 7 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 46½° W., 61 lks. dist., mkd. T31S R5W S24 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, madrone, yew, hemlock, alder, chinquapin, oak, willow, and pine; undergrowth, salal, Oregon grape, poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, blackberry, huckleberry, wild rose, vine maple, rhododendron, manzanita, ferns, and young timber.

N. 0° 18' W., on the E. bdy. of sec. 24.

Descend over broken NE. slope, though heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

5.75 Three-wire power transmission line, bears N. 30° W. and S. 30° E.

5.88 Point for the closing cor. of secs. 19 and 30, T. 31 S., R. 4 W., at proportionate distance, hereinafter described.

Descend over broken NE. slope.

19.87 The S 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 24 only, T. 31 S., R. 5 W., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set projecting 5 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
