chinquapin, and dogwood. The undergrowth consists of salal. Oregon grape, hazel, arrowwood, blackberry, poison oak, manzanita, rhododendron, ceanothus, salmonberry, huckleberry, wild rose, vine maple, ferns, and young timber.

Access is gained via gravelled roads branching from paved roads along Beals Creek and Cow Creek, and numerous other dirt and gravelled roads.

No mineral deposits were noted along the lines resurveyed. The land is used mainly for timber and recreational purposes.

The average of a number of readings throughout the area gives a value of $18^{\circ} 30'$ E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of $3/4^{\circ}$ due to local attraction.
