GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are located about 10 miles west of the town of Sutherlin, Oregon, in Douglas County. The area is drained by the Umpqua River which runs westerly through the south portion of section 9. The elevation ranges from about 320 feet above sea level on the Umpqua River, to about 960 feet above sea level at the 1/4 section corner of sections 4 and 9. Most of the government lands are covered with heavy stands of timber. The predominant species of timber are fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, and oak. The undergrowth consists of hazel, salal, poison oak, madrone, blackberry, fern, Oregon grape, chinquapin, dogwood, and wild rose.

The main access into the area is by way of Tyee Road, which is a county road paralleling the right bank of the Umpqua River.

The soil consists of a rocky clay with a shallow overlay of humus.

No evidence of mineral deposits was noted during the course of the resurvey.

The magnetic declination for the area surveyed is 20° E., as shown on the Tyee, Oregon 15 minute quadrangle, dated 1955.
