GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area covered by this resurvey is located about two and one-half miles northeasterly from the small town of Scottsburg, Oregon. The area is drained by Wells Creek which flows southerly to the Umpqua River. Access is gained by way of Wells Creek Road. The elevations range from about 200 feet above sea level at the 1/4 section corner of sections 5 and 8, to about 900 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 31 and 32 only, on the south boundary of township 21 south, range 9 west.

The soil is composed of rocky clay loam. The lands are forested with fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, chinkapin, and madrone. The undergrowth consists of vine maple, huckleberry, salmonberry, Oregon grape, poison oak, manzanita, salal, rhododendron, arrowwood, young timber, and ferns.

No mineral deposits were noted in the area covered by the resurvey.

The average of a number of readings taken throughout the area gives a value of 19 3/4° E, for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° in local attraction.
