(Restoring the survey by Samuel C. Flint, in 1882,  
 and the remonumentation by Harold D. Corbin, in 1958)

Beginning at the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962, from original evidence which is no longer in existence, monumented with an iron rod 3/4 in. diam., loosely set and bent over, protruding 10 ins. above ground, from which abearing tree mkd. by Byron:

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 79° W., 82 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

from which a new bearing tree

A maple, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 37½° E., 97 lks. dist., mkd. T27S R3W S36 SC BT.

Deposit iron rod alongside stainless steel post.

From this point, a point established by person (s) unknown, bears East, 0.14 chs. dist. monumented with an iron rod, 3/4 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground.

S. 89° 39' W. on the S. bdy. of sec. 35, marking and blazing the true line.

Ascend along broken S. slope, through young timber and moderate undergrowth.

The standard 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 35, perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962, monumented with an iron rod 3/4 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 18 ins. above a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, from which the remains of original bearing trees:

A fir snag, 80 ins. diam., bears S. 85° E., 97 lks. dist., burned with no marks visible.  
 (Record, 110 lks.)

A double fir, 72 ins. diam., bears N. 65° W., 68½ lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on bark blaze and a healed blaze.  
 (Record, 65 lks.)
