A sawed madrone stump, 32 ins. diam., bears  
 N. 28° E., 50 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT  
 visible on opened blaze.

A root hole, bears S. 65° E., 66 lks. dist., with  
 down fir alongside, 32 ins. diam., with healed  
 blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 34 ins. diam., bears N. 55° W.,  
 57 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 49 3/4° E., 18 lks.  
 dist. mkd. T27S R3W S14 BT.

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 34 1/4° E., 21 1/2 lks.  
 dist., mkd. T27S R3W S23 BT.

A grand fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 53 1/2° W., 53  
 lks. dist., mkd. T27S R3W S22 BT.

A cedar, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 36 1/2° W., 79 lks.  
 dist., mkd. T27S R3W S15 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, oak, fir, hemlock, madrone, yew, alder, cedar, maple  
 and pine; undergrowth, poison oak, vine maple, ocean spray  
 hazel, fern blackberry, huckleberry, Oregon grape, salal, and  
 young timber.

From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 23 and 26.

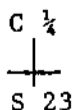
N. 0° 11' W., on the N. and S. center line of sec. 23.

40.73 The center 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 23, established and  
 recorded by Ben B. Irving, Deputy County Surveyor, in  
 1947, perpetuated and recorded by Gregory E. Quibell,  
 Deputy County Surveyor, in 1981, and is accepted as  
 the corner, monumented with an iron post, 1 1/2 ins.  
 diam., firmly set, projecting 15 ins. above ground,  
 with brass cap mkd.
