## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this survey are located in Douglas County, approximately four miles easterly from the town of Days Creek, Oregon.

The drainage is southerly toward the South Umpqua River. The elevations range from about 1000 feet to 2000 feet above sea level.

Access is via logging roads branching from State Highway No. 227.

The soil is composed of rocky clay in the higher elevations and clay loam in the creek bottoms.

The timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, yew, maple, chinquapin, oak, madrone, myrtle and alder with undergrowth of salal, firn, poison oak, vine maple, rhododendron, arrowwood, blackberry, salmonberry and huckleberry.

No evidence of mineral activity was noted in the course of the survey.

The average of a number of readings over the area gives a value of 20° 00' E., for the mean magnetic declination with a range of 1" due to local attraction.
