CHAINS

From the 1/4 sec.cor. of secs. 25 and 36, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 7 ins. above ground with brass cap mkd.

from which the remains of an original bearing tree

A root hole, bears N. 50° W., 25 lks. dist.,

and bearing trees mkd. by Brooks and Peterson

A hemlock, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 16½° W.,
39 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record,
S. 14½° E., 38 lks.)

A cedar, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 74½° W., 36 lks.
dist., with scribe marks ¼ S25 BT visible on open
blaze. (Record, N. 27° W., 93 lks.)

N. 0° 15' W., on the N. and S. center line of sec. 25, marking and blazing the true line.

Descend over NE. slope, through scattering timber and moderate undergrowth.

4.60 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course S. 65° E.; asc. over SW. slope.

5.30 Gravelled road, 30 lks. wide, bears N. 35° W. and S. 30° E., in curve.

15.20 Spur, slopes S. 45° W.; desc. over NW. slope.

20.01 Point for the center S 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 25.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 64 ¾° W.,
18 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 29½° W.,
36½ lks. dist., with healed blaze.

The corner is located at head of ravine, drains S. 40° W.

Ascend over broken SW. slope.

36.50 Top of ascent; desc. over broken NW. slope.

40.02 The center ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 25, established and recorded by Forrest Hales, Registered Land Surveyor No. 453, in 1978, and is accepted as the corner, monumented with an iron rod, 5/8 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, from which bearing trees mkd. by Hales:

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. ½° E., 9
lks. dist., with healed blaze.
