A root hole, bears N. 18¼° E., 111 lks. dist., with down oak alongside, 24 ins. diam., no marks visible.

A fir stub, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 59½° W., 118 lks. dist., with rotted face.

A root hole, bears N. 5¼° W., 69 lks. dist., with down oak alongside, 16 ins. diam., no marks visible

and bearing trees mkd. by Milo E. Godfrey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963

A white oak, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 68 ¾° E., 32 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A white oak, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 64¼° E., 37 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A white oak, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 23½° W., 63 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 50 ¾° W., 48 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

S. 88° 41' W., bet. secs. 26 and 35.

Descend over gentle W. slope, through scattering timber and open meadows.

7.00 Creek, 15 lks. wide, course S. 5° E.; asc. over SE. slope.

17.30 Spur, slopes N. 55° E.; desc. over NW slope.

19.40 Down woven wire fence, bears N. and S.

19.83 The E 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 35, unofficially established by L. W. Barber, Federal Highway Administration, in 1974, filed in the County Surveyor's Records in 1984, and is accepted as the corner, monumented with an iron rod, ½ in. diam., firmly set, projecting 2 ins. above ground, from which the bearing trees mkd. by Barber:

A fir, 21 ins. diam., bears N. 61½° E., 67 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.

A dogwood, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 74½° W., 22 lks. dist., with partially healed double blaze.
