A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 83½° W., 128 lks. dist., with scribe marks N 1/16 S34 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

**GENERAL DESCRIPTION**

The area covered by this survey and resurvey is located in Douglas County, approximately 9½ miles northeast of Sutherlin, Oregon. Access is by way of Sutherlin-Nonpareil Highway to Long Valley Creek Road. The area is drained southwesterly by Long Valley Creek and Cantell Creek with numerous other small and seasonal drainages. The area is mountainous with elevations ranging from about 880 feet above sea level at the ¼ section corner of sections 35 and 36, to about 1360 feet above sea level at the ¼ section corner of sections 26 and 35.

The soil consists of a rocky clay. There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines resurveyed. The timber consists of fir, cedar, ash, maple, madrone, white oak, dogwood, and hemlock. The undergrowth consists of salal, poison oak, Oregon grape, arrowwood, blackberry, ferns, vine maple and young timber.

The land is used mainly for timber production. The lower elevations and valleys are used also for cattle grazing.

The average of a number of readings along the lines resurveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of 18° 15' E., with a range in local attraction of 30'.
