**GENERAL DESCRIPTION**

The lands included in the foregoing survey are located approximately five miles southwesterly from Elkton, Oregon, on the west side of the Umpqua River in Douglas County. Access into the area is by way of Mehl Creek Road and Waggoner Creek Road, with numerous gravel and dirt logging roads branching from them

The area is mountainous, with elevations ranging from 160 feet above sea level in the Northeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 13, to 2320 feet above sea level in the southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 28.

The soil is composed of clay loam in the lower elevations to rocky in the higher elevations, with lands forested with fir, cedar, hemlock, alder, madrone, maple, and myrtle. The undergrowth consists of salmonberry, salal, huckleberry, Oregon grape, poison oak, vine maple, hazel, ferns, and grasses.

No evidence of mineral activity was noted in the area covered by this survey.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° East, for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to 1° due to local attraction.
