GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this survey are located in Douglas County. Section 28 is approximately 12 miles northeast of the town of Azalea, and section 6 is approximately 5½ miles southwest of Days Creek, Oregon. Access is by way of State Highway No. 227 and by Cow Creek Highway, and numerous other gravel and dirt roads. The area is drained northerly by East Fork Poole Creek into the South Umpqua River, and southerly by numerous small streams into Cow Creek. The area is mountainous with elevations ranging from about 1600 feet above sea level to about 3400 feet above sea level.

The soil consists of a rocky clay. There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines resurveyed. The timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, yew oak, alder, live oak, madrone, maple, and chinkapin. The undergrowth consists of salal, poison oak, Oregon grape, arrowwood, rhododendron, huckleberry, blackberry, ferns, and vine maple.

The land is used mainly for timber production with various ages of growth.

The average of a number of readings along the lines resurveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of 20° E., with a range of up to 1° 45' due to local attraction.
