CHAINS

(Restoring the survey by Dennis Hathorn, in 1855)

Beginning at the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31, and 36, on the E. bdy. of the Tp., perpetuated and recorded by Vernon R. Tracy, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1968, further perpetuated and recorded by Gregory Quibell, deputy County Surveyor, in 1982, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A pine, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 27½° E., 87 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on a partially healed blaze. (Record, N. 25° E.)

A fir, 31 ins. diam., bears N. 44° W., 37 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, N. 47° W.)

and the remains of the bearing trees mkd. by Tracy

An oak, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 65° E., 51 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on a partially healed blaze.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 49° E., 25 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 79½° W., 39 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

An oak snag, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 10° W., 44 lks. dist., with scribe marks T30S R9W S25 CS BT visible on a partially healed blaze.

N. 0° 22' W., bet. secs. 25 and 30.

Ascend over a broken SW. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

32.20 Ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. over NW. slope.

37.95 Gravel road, 30 lks. wide, bears W. and W. 70° E.

40.03 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 30, perpetuated and recorded by Vernon R. Tracy, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1964, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
