dist., mkd. 1/4 S30 BT.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 82 1/2° W., 60 1/2
lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S25 BT.

From this corner, United States Coast and Geodetic Survey
triangulation station "Live Oak," bears N. 83° 29' 30" E.,
330.250 chs. dist., monumented with a bronze tablet, set in a
concrete post, 10 ins. sq., firmly set flush with the ground,
mkd. LIVE OAK 1942.

N. 0° 07' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend over broken NW. slope.

- 0.55 A fir stump, 40 ins. diam.,
- 2.20 Gravel road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 70° E. and S. 70° W.
- 19.90 Slope changes to NE.; continue to descend.
- 30.90 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 15° W.; cross broken W. slope.
- 39.74 The cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, perpetuated and recorded by
Vernon R. Tracy, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1964, monumented with
an iron post, 1 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above
ground, with brass cap mkd.

dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 112 lks.)

A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears S. 66° E., 47 lks.
dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 48 lks.)

A root hole, bears S. 32° W., 27 lks. dist., with
a downed fir, 23 ins. diam., lying alongside,
with healed blaze.

A fir stump, 52 ins. diam., bears N. 15° W., 122
lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 35 1/2° E., 15 1/2 lks.
dist., with healed double blaze.

A yew, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 42 1/2° E., 46 lks.
dist., with scribe marks S30 CS BT visible on
an open blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 12 ins. diam., bears
N. 39 1/2° W., 49 lks. dist., with scribe marks
30S R9W S24 visible on a partially healed blaze.
