	A fir stump, 42 ins. diam., bears S. 50° E., 7 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on bark. (Record, S. 40° E., 6 lks.)
	A madrone snag, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 25° W., 27 lks. dist., no visible marks.
	A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 30° W., 48 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on bark. (Record, 45 lks.)
	and the remains of bearing trees mks. by Powell
	A fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 30° E., 72 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on rotted blaze.
	A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 51° W., 19 lks. dist., with scribe marks T31S R8W CS visible on partially healed blaze.
	A cedar, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 29° W., 26 lks. dist., with scribe marks T31S R8W S2 CS visible on partially healed blaze.

	A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 27° E., 105 lks. dist., mkd. T31S R8W S1 BT.
	A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 20° E., 26 lks. dist., mkd. T31S R8W S12 BT.
	From this point, National Geodetic Survey triangulation station "Live Oak," bears N. 17° 59' 30" W., 232.806 chs. dist., monumented with a bronze tablet, set in a concrete post, 10 ins. sq., firmly set flush with the surface of the ground, marked LIVE OAK 1942.
	S. 89° 35' W., bet. secs. 2 and 11.
