GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this survey are located in Douglas County approximately 10 miles northeasterly of the town of Days Creek, Oregon.

The drainage is southwesterly. The elevations range from 1500 to 2500 feet above sea level.

Access is via the Days Creek Road.

The soil is compsed of rocky clay in the higher elevations and clay loam in the creek bottoms.

The timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, yew, maple chinquapin, oak, madrone, and alder, with undergrowth of salal, fern, poison oak, vine maple, rhododendron, arrowwood, blackberry, salmonberry, and huckleberry.

No evidence of mineral activity was noted in the course of the survey.

The average of a number of readings over the area gives a value of 20° 00' E. for the mean magnetic declination, with a range of 1° due to local attraction.
