CHAINS

Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky clay loam.
Timber, fir, cedar, alder, maple, dogwood, and madrone;
undergrowth, vine maple, huckleberry, salmonberry, Oregon grape,
poison oak, salal, ferns, and grasses.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands involved in the foregoing survey are located in Douglas County, Oregon, approximately two miles northeasterly of the small town of Scottsburg. Access into the area is by way of State Highway No. 38, with a few private dirt and gravelled roads leading into the section surveyed.

The area is drained primarily by Purdy creek, which meanders southerly along the east boundaries of the sections surveyed. The elevation ranges from about 240 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 8, 9, 16, and 17, to about 1210 feet above sea level at the closing corner of sections 3 and 4 on the north boundary of the township.

The soil is generally a rocky clay loam, from a few inches to several feet in depth, overlaying sandstone bedrock. The timber is predominantly fir, hemlock, alder, maple, cedar, and dogwood; the undergrowth consists of huckleberry, salmonberry, rhododendron, vine maple, poison oak, Oregon grape, ferns, and grasses.

The magnetic declination for the area is 20° East, as shown on the Scottsburg, Oregon, provisional quadrangle, dated 1985.
