**CHAINS**

A fir snag, 54 ins. diam., bears S. 68° W., 16 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 20 lks.)

A cedar stump, 47 ins. diam., bears N. 4° W., 20 lks. dist., no marks visible on opened blaze. (Record, 11 lks.)

and the remains of a bearing tree mkd. by Price

A cedar stump, 47 ins. diam., bears N. 37¼° W., 41 lks. dist., no marks visible.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Vernon R. Tracy, deputy County Surveyor, in 1966

A fir stump, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 36½° E., 26 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 31½° W., 52 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

S. 88° 54' 00" W., beginning new measurement.

Descend over broken NW. slope.

8.60 Ravine, drains SW.; asc. over broken E. slope.

20.890 Point for the W 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 34.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 5 ins. diam., bears South, 32 lks. dist., mkd. W 1/16 S3 BT.

Deposit a white "DEEP-1" magnetic marker at the base of the stainless steel post.

Continue over broken E. slope.

29.90 Spur, slopes S.; desc. over broken SW. slope.

32.70 Ravine, drains S.; asc. over SE. slope.

35.90 Spur, slopes SW.; desc. over steep W. slope.

41.780 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, monumented with an iron post 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
