CHAINS

and bearing trees mkd. by Vernon R. Tracy, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1966

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears N.  $19\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E., 13 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed double blaze.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.  $14\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E., 25 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

S.  $87^{\circ} 46' 00''$  W., bet. secs. 9 and 16.

Descend over NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.35 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N.  $10^{\circ}$  W.; asc. over NE. slope.

10.20 Spur, slopes N.; desc. over NW. slope.

22.510 Point for the W  $1/16$  sec. cor. of secs. 9 and 16.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A hemlock, 16 ins. diam., bears N.  $79^{\circ}$  E.,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist., mkd. W  $1/16$  S9 BT.

A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S.  $37^{\circ}$  W., 19 lks. dist., mkd. W  $1/16$  S16 BT.

Deposit a white "DEEP-1" magnetic marker at the base of the stainless steel post.

Descend over NW. slope.

23.45 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N.  $60^{\circ}$  W.; desc. over broken NW. slope.

41.35 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course N.  $30^{\circ}$  W.; asc. over NE. slope.

43.55 Spur, slopes N.  $15^{\circ}$  E.; desc. over NW. slope.

45.020 The cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A maple, 26 ins. diam., bears S.  $31^{\circ}$  W., 32 lks. dist., no marks visible on decayed blaze.

A cedar, 23 ins. diam., bears N.  $50^{\circ}$  E., 86 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.  $60^{\circ}$  W., 102 lks. dist., with healed blaze.
