CHAINS

The soil consists of rocky clay. There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines surveyed.

The timber consists of fir, yew, hemlock, maple, cedar, chinquapin, ash, alder, pine, madrone, and cherry. The undergrowth consists of salal, poison oak, vine maple, huckleberry, ferns, blackberry, manzanita, Oregon grape, arrowwood, hazel, salmonberry, wild rose, and young fir.

The land is used mainly for timber production. The private ownership in section 32 is used for grazing.

The average of a number of readings along the lines surveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of $19\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E., with no local attraction.
