ranging from about 740 feet above sea level at the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner of sections 19 and 30, to about 1680 feet above sea level near the closing corner of sections 17 and 18.

The soil consists of a rocky clay. There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines surveyed. The timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, madrone, maple, pine, and chinquapin. The undergrowth consists of salal, poison oak, Oregon grape, ocean spray, hazel, huckleberry, blackberry, fern, vine maple, and young fir.

The land is used mainly for timber production. Section 19 is subdivided with several residential homes.

The average of a number of readings along the lines resurveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of $18 \frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E., with a range of $\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ in local attraction.
