- Descend over steep NW. slope, changing to steep N. slope.
- 68.00 Bottom of descent, slopes W.; asc. over SW. slope.
- 73.70 Spur, slopes N. 60° W.; desc. over N. slope.
- 79.560 The cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13, and 18, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 15 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

- A root hole, bears S. 8° E., 18 lks. dist., alongside of which lies a fir, 40 ins. diam., no marks visible.
- A fir, 27 ins. diam., bears N. 63° W., 71 lks. dist., no marks visible.

- A fir snag, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 72° E., 141½ lks. dist., with scribe marks T32S R6W S7 CS BT visible on open, double blaze.
- A fir, 31 ins. diam., bears S. 85° E., 58½ lks. dist., with healed, double blaze.
- A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 76° W., 87½ lks. dist., with healed, double blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Popken and Carlson and redescribed by Roseberry

- A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 69½° E., 96 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

- A fir stump, 42 ins. diam., bears S. 41° E., 118 lks. dist., with healed blaze.
- A fir snag, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 38° W., 56 lks. dist., with open blaze, no marks visible on a pitched over face. (Record, 58 lks.)
