A root hole, bears N.  $18^\circ$  W., 45 lks. dist., with a dead and down fir, 30 ins. diam., alongside, with a burned and rotted blaze, no marks visible.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.  $55^\circ$  W., 27 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N.  $0\ 3/4^\circ$  W., 67 lks. dist. with healed blaze. (Record, N.  $1^\circ$  E.)

S.  $89^\circ\ 17'\ 30''$  W., beginning new measurement.

Ascend E. slope, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.

Ascend E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
