45 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A root hole, bears N. 22° W., 48 lks. dist., with a down
cedar alongside, size indeterminate, no marks visible

and the remains of the bearing trees mkd. by Byron

A cedar snag, 25 ins. diam., bears N. 79° E.,
33 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir snag, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 34 3/4° W.,
15 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

N. 0° 46' 30" E., beginning new measurement.

Ascend over broken SE. slope.

3.35 Spur, slopes N. 50° E.; desc. over broken NE. slope.

14.65 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S. 75° E.; asc. over broken SE. slope.

26.30 Spur, slopes N. 50° E.; desc. over broken NE. slope.

32.95 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S. 55° E.; asc. over SE. slope.

34.00 Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 65° W. and S. 65° E.

40.075 The cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17, and 18 (the monument reestablished in 1958 was found out of position under a rock slide), determined at record distance from the remains of the bearing trees mkd. by Corbin:

A fir snag, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 65° E., 62 lks. dist.,
with healed blaze. (Record S. 71 1/2° E.)

A fir snag, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 56 1/4° W., 38 lks. dist.,
with scribe mark 2 visible on opened blaze. (Record
S. 59° W.)

At the corner point

Reset the iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 14 ins. in the
ground, in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, to top, with brass cap
mkd.
