80 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 31° E., 27 lks. dist.,
with healed double blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 32 1/4° E.,
47 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears S. 17° W., 88 lks. dist.,
with healed double blaze.

A fir, 31 ins. diam., bears N. 50 1/2° W., 22 1/2 lks. dist.,
with healed double blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 58 1/4° E., 38 1/2 lks. dist.,
mkd. T22S R4W S5 BT.

S. 89° 16' 00" W., bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Ascend over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

1.30 Ridge, bears N. 15° W. and S. 10° E., and also dirt road, 15 lks.
wide, bears same; desc. over broken SW. slope.

4.30 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 5° W. and S. 5° E.

15.25 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 30° W.; asc. over NE. slope.

Floyd J. Cole, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1914, from original
evidence no longer in existence, and further perpetuated and
recorded by Milo E. Godfrey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962;
monumented with an iron bolt, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting
4 ins. above ground, from which the remains of bearing trees mkd.
by Godfrey:

A root hole, bears S. 32° E., 96 lks. dist., with a
down fir alongside, size indeterminate, no marks visible.

A fir, 33 ins. diam., bears N. 23 1/2° W., 49 lks. dist.,
with healed double blaze.
