GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing resurvey are located in hilly country along Interstate Route 5 in Douglas County, about one mile northeast and one mile southwest of Curtin, Oregon. The elevation ranges from approximately 400 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 29, 30, 31, and 32, to about 1200 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 5, 6, 31, and 32, on the south boundary of the township.

The areas are drained by Pass Creek, Ward Creek, Buck Creek, Thief Creek, and numerous other small and seasonal drainages. The soil consists of a rocky clay in the upper elevations and a clay loam in the creek bottoms. The timber consists of fir, cedar, hemlock, yew, pine, alder, madrone, oak, maple, chinquapin, dogwood, and cascara buckthorn. The undergrowth is mainly salal, Oregon grape, hazel, manzanita, blackberry, arrowwood, poison oak, Scotch broom, huckleberry, wild rose, vine maple, thimbleberry, salmonberry, and young timber.

Access is gained via Interstate Route 5 and State Highway No. 99, with other paved, gravelled, and dirt roads branching from them into the area.
