Quibell, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1981; monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

An oak, 19 ins. dia., bears N. 61° W., 30 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record 36 lks.)

An oak, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 23° W., 80 lks. dist., with scribe marks T30S R4W S14 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

No other suitable trees available.

N. 89° 52' 00" E., bet. secs. 13 and 24.

Descend over NE. slope, through rolling pastureland.

0.75 Ravine, drains S. 20° E.; asc. over SW. slope.

3.15 Spur, slopes S.; desc. over SE. slope.

8.25 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S. 10° E.; asc. over broken SW. slope.

29.35 Spur, slopes S.; desc. over SE. slope, also enter Bland Mountain Fire area.

33.00 Ravine, drains S. 20° E.; asc. over SW. slope.

36.20 Spur, slopes S. 5° E.; desc. over SE. slope.

37.300 The original closing cor. of secs. 13 and 24, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
