CHAINS

A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears N. 10° W., 23½ lks. dist.,
mkd. X BT.

Deposit a white "DEEP-1" magnetic marker at base of stainless steel post.

Descend over NW. slope.

23.90 Gravelled road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. and S.

32.40 Canton Creek Road, oiled, 30 lks. wide, bears NW. and SE.

37.70 Canton Creek, 150 lks. wide, course S. 30° E.; asc. over broken NE. slope.

40.300 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 14, perpetuated but not recorded by Thomas E. Shrum, Jr., Registered Engineer No. 4287, in 1964, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

A hemlock snag, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 45° W., 11 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S11 visible on open blaze.

A cedar, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 17° E., 65 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed double blaze.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 33° W., 45 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed double blaze.

S. 89° 28' 00" W., beginning new measurement.

Ascend over NE. slope.

5.50 Spur, slopes N. 15° E.; asc. over broken E. slope.

43.350 The cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15, perpetuated and recorded by Milo E. Godfrey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962, and further perpetuated and recorded by Vernon R. Tracy, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1966; monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
