### GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area covered by this survey is located in Douglas County approximately nine and one-half miles northeast of Oakland, Oregon. Access is by way of County Road No. 69, and numerous other gravel and dirt roads. The area is drained northwesterly by Elk Creek with numerous other small and seasonal drainages. The area is mountainous with elevations ranging from about 1200 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 2, 3, 10, and 11, to about 1500 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 2 and 3 on the north boundary of the township.

The soil consists of a rocky clay. There were no mineral deposits noted along the line surveyed. The timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, chinquapin, alder, oak, white fir, and madrone. The undergrowth consists of salal, rhododendron, poison oak, vine maple, Oregon grape, hazel, Scotch broom, manzanita and ferns.

The land is used mainly for timber production.

The magnetic declination is 19° East, determined from one reading along the line surveyed.
