CHAINS

The lands are forested with fir, cedar, hemlock, yew, pine, alder, maple, oak, madrone, willow, ash, and chinquapin. Undergrowth consists of ferns, poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, Oregon grape, salal, huckleberry, blackberry, thimbleberry, salmonberry, wild rose, manzanita, and young timber.

Access is gained via State Highway No. 42, Hard Cash Lane, and West Side Road, with other graveled and dirt roads branching from them into the area.

There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines surveyed. The land is used primarily for residences, farming, and timber production.

Observations taken along the lines surveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of $19^{\circ} 15'$ East, with a range of $0^{\circ} 15'$ in local attraction.
