T. 29 S., R. 8 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

**CHAINS**

(Restoring the survey by Dennis Hathorn, in 1855,  
and the resurvey by Fred Mensch, in 1924)

From the cor. of secs. 24 and 25 only, on the E. bdy. of the Tp.,  
monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting  
14 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A madrone clump, 4 ft. base, with 5 trunks and hollow  
center, bears S. 42° E., 46 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A fir, 45 ins. diam., bears S. 20° W., 6 lks. dist.,  
with healed blaze.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Mensch

A root hole, bears S. 15° W., 60 lks. dist., with a down  
cedar alongside, 48 ins. diam., no marks visible.

A root hole, bears N. 65° W., 48 lks. dist., with a down  
fir alongside, 14 ins. diam., with fragmentary scribe  
marks visible on open blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor,  
in 1962

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 65° W., 23 lks. dist.,  
with healed double blaze.

A cedar, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 51° W., 27 lks. dist.,  
with healed double blaze.

N. 89° 58' 00" W., bet. secs. 24 and 25.

Ascend over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

1.80 Top of ascent, slopes N.; desc. over NW. slope.

2.830 Intersect line 2-3 of Tract 54, point for the crossing closing  
corner, hereinafter described.

From this point, Cor. No. 3 of Tract 54, bears S. 1° 17' 00" W.,  
6.160 chs. dist., hereinafter described.

Descend over NW. slope.

5.70 Ravine, drains NW.; asc. over NE. slope.

10.20 Spur, slopes N. 20° E.; desc. over broken NW. slope.

22.55 Creek, 1 lks. wide, course NE.; asc. over NE. slope.

39.920 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 24 and 25, monumented with an iron post,  
1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, with  
brass cap mkd.
