GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing resurvey are located approximately five miles southerly of Tenmile, Oregon. The elevations range from 2000 feet above sea level near the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner of sections 24 and 25, to about 1200 feet above sea level near Corner No. 2 of Tract 54.

The area is drained by Coarse Gold Creek flowing northeasterly to Olalla Creek, and Bear Creek flowing northwesterly to Berry Creek, with numerous other small and seasonal drainages flowing into them. The soil consists of a rocky clay. The lands are forested with fir, cedar, hemlock, yew, pine, alder, cherry, maple, oak, madrone, willow, ash, and chinquapin. Undergrowth consists of ferns, poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, Oregon grape, salal, huckleberry, blackberry, thimbleberry, salmonberry, gooseberry, currant, wild rose, rhododendron, manzanita, and young timber.

Access is gained via a paved road along Olalla Creek and a graveled road along Berry Creek, with several graveled and dirt roads branching from them into the area.

There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines resurveyed. The land is used primarily for timber production and recreation.

The average of a number of readings in the area gives a value of 19° 30' East for the mean magnetic declination.
