CHAINS

mkd. by Tillman, Holm and Brooks:

A fir, 27 ins. diam., bears S. 11° W., 16 lks. dist.,
with healed blaze.

A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 34½° W., 27 lks. dist.,
with healed blaze. (Record, 28 lks.)

At the corner point

Reset the iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., on bedrock, over a mark < chiseled in the bedrock, and in a mound of stone, 6 ft. base to top.

N. 4° 18' 00" E., beginning new measurement.

Ascend SE. slope, through timber.

6.50 Spur, slopes S. 60° E.; desc. NE. slope.

10.785 From this point, the ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 30 only, T. 19 S., R. 9 W., erroneously established by Tillman, Holm, and Brooks in 1957-58, bears West, 0.215 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record. Remove the iron post and obliterate the scribe marks on the bearing trees.

12.50 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 80° E.

27.20 North Fork Smith River, 75 lks. wide, course N. 60° E.; asc. broken SW. slope.

45.70 Ravine, drains N. 60° W.; asc. SW. slope.

46.310 The cor. of secs. 24 and 25 only, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 39 ins. diam., bears N. 29° W., 68 lks. dist.
with scribe marks T19S R10W S25 BT visible on partially
healed blaze. (Record, N. 40° W.)

From the cor. of secs. 12 and 13 only, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
